As you will have seen from the minute of the last meeting of the Council of the Bailies of Bennachie, I was asked to write to you regarding the Mither Tap Fort.

The Council has felt for some time that it would be appropriate to erect a suitable plaque, outlining the history and importance of the fort. The plaque would be similar in design to those used by the Scottish Development Department at ancient monuments, and the S.D.D. has already indicated that they would be happy to advise us on a suitable inscription and its manufacture.


It seems that a proportion of the visitors to the Mither Tap do not realise that there is a fort, and this has resulted in damage being done to the walls through ignorance.

The Council is also considering the possibility of constructing a small bridge over the Rushmill Burn. We anticipate that the bridge will be of benefit in two ways: firstly, by reducing bank erosion, which is becoming quite significant, and secondly, by directing pedestrians onto the next section of path, which on the ascent crosses a small bog and is easily missed.

We would ask you to give your consideration to both of these projects and hope to receive your approval in the near future. If you require any further details, please do not hesitate to contact me.
